CEO's **END OF YEAR MESSAGE**

Season's Greetings to you. Let us give thanks to the Most High for seeing us through another year.

The end of any period is a time where one should reflect, take stock and look to the future. Indeed, this year has been a difficult one, not only for Bui Power Authority but also for Ghana and the world over. Circumstances in parts of the world have caused negative ripple effects that have seen our economy take a nosedive which we are still working to resurrect. It has always been my opinion that a time of crisis reveals true character and opportunities. This period has confirmed what I have always known and experienced - the hard work and relentlessness of the BPA workforce. Despite all the doom and gloom, you put your head down and continued to press on. Your past efforts, which have yielded some good dividends allowed management to provide some little cushion for the prevailing hardship.

As mandated, our renewable drive got off to a brilliant start when I signed our agreement with First-Sky Construction Limited in Yendi, to begin construction of a 50MWp solar plant in Yendi. Once completed, the power generated form this plant will address power issues in the Northern Parts of Ghana and Yendi in particular.

Our Sugarcane plantation has also started well and is due for harvest and replanting. By the time the factory is ready, the first phase of the 6940-Hectare will be ready to produce 60.000 tons annually.

The rains offered us a chance to carry out a wet test to ensure that our spillway gates were in good operational order, and I am pleased to say, that they are. I am, however, more pleased to inform you that this year has seen us generate our highest level of power since the inception of Bui Power Authority, which stood at 1411GWh as at December 4 and projected to a level in excess of 1500 GWh by the end of 2022

As you will see in the coming pages, we have undertaken various activities to help the communities as well.

The CEO was accompanied by two members of the Board, as well as some members of Staff.
























UNDP VISIT

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Resident Representative in Ghana, Dr. Angela Lusigi, visited the Bui Generating Station (BGS) from September 12–16, 2022 as part of UNDP Global Environment Facility & Small Grants Programme (GEF SGP) which is focused on the Black Volta Basin socio-ecological production landscape.

The trip afforded the UNDP Resident Representative the opportunity to hold discussions on a possible collaboration with BPA in the expansion of our tree planting exercise under the FREP, Bui City Development and our on-going renewable energy initiatives

Whilst on the visit she expressed her belief that Ghana is on the right track to achieving what she described as "an ambitious target" in the renewable energy mix.

Speaking after the tour, she also alluded to an opinion that more needs to be, and could be done to reach the goals. Dr. Lusigi toured key sections of the generation station and the solar energy farm, including the control rooms and floating solar panels installed on the hydro dam's reservoir.

Observing the diverse opportunities for growth in the sector, She stated "Ghana has an ambitious target, and I believe this is definitely on the pathway of achieving it."

She commended the Authority for the work on reforestation and said, "Not only are we looking at energy generation but also helping the communities maintain the resources that are necessary to continue enjoying some of these benefits".

BPA PARTNERS WITH THE ROBB FOUNDATION TO UNDERTAKE HEALTH SCREENING WITHIN THE RESETTLEMENT TOWNSHIPS



Having welfare administration high on its mandate list, the Community Relations Unit, using the Authority's CSR facet of "Health", orchestrated a two-week long health screening exercise for the children in the immediate communities, with the help of The Robb Foundation.

The plan was birthed after the Unit spotted a child with Down Syndrome who appeared to have been ostracized during one of its regular engagements with a community. This necessitated the urgent need to screen the children in the community and sensitize the communities about Down Syndrome and other child-disability illnesses.

Thus, from October 3rd - October 12th 2022, a team of Health professionals from Robb Foundation set up shop in the Bui Enclave to screen children from the ages 4 - 16 within the Resettled Communities for any health abnormalities, as well as lecture parents and the communities on general health and well-being principles based on their findings.
















BPA at the Ghana Industrial Summit 2022

The CEO, Hon. Samuel Kofi Ahiave Dzamesi picked up awards in the following categories.


- 1. Outstanding CEO of the year Public Sector
